26 small framed panels: art and poetry



Luba Krugman Gurdus is a talented artist, poet and author who has written extensively about her experiences at the Majdanek Concentration Camp, most notably in her book, *The Death Train*.

These stark, expressive drawings, facimiles from the portfolio *_They Didn't Live to See*, are combined with selections from her *Painful Echos...Poems of The Holocaust_* to create a powerful expression of tragedy and courage.

This small exhibit tells an intensely personal story about the horror Jews faced at the hands of the Nazis. With her eyewitness accounts, in well-chosen words and wrenching drawings, Gurdus bravely shows us a world that few of us could ever imagine.

Exhibit includes:
